Assignment	<p>Make a rubbing of at least three different textures you can find in your home or in your backyard. Use a pencil or crayons and paper. Cut out your texture rubbings into different sized circles and glue onto a black piece of paper to make a solar system.</p>	<p>Create various textures from household items and nature in play dough. Roll play dough out to 1/2" thickness and press objects into surface of dough. Try bottles/ caps, shells, rocks, edges of cardboard, ends of pens/markers, small toys, etc.</p>	<p>Create a digital poster using online pics showing the following textures: smooth, rough, soft, bumpy, spiky and hard OR draw your own pics showing real-life objects that have those textures.</p>	<p>Create a landscape using various textures from either your home/nature or create your own using line. Draw the outline of your lanscape, fill in with texture, using markers, crayolas or colored pencil to fill in.</p>
